



Children living in World War II

In this unit children will learn about why WWII began and when and where it took place. They will learn about key dates and events leading up to the war. They will know the characteristic features of the Blitz and locate where bombing raids took place. Children will be able to explain the causes of evacuation experience and, through role play, experience what it was like to be an evacuee!



History Curriculum Overview

Year 3

Savage Saxons and Vicious Vikings

In this unit children will find out about how invaders have shaped the history of the British Isles and develop their understanding of reasons for and consequences of invaders and settlers. Children will understand where the Anglo-Saxons settled and when they came. Children will know about what was discovered at Sutton Hoo and will make inferences from archaeological evidence. Children will learn about the way of life of the Anglo-Saxons.

Children will locate on a time line the period when the Vikings made raids and to understand why the Viking people explored many parts of the world and the impact this had.



Wolverhampton: A Local History Study

In this local study pupils are introduced to an enquiry based approach to a local study of Wolverhampton. Children will be focusing on historical aspects of the city of Wolverhampton in the past and then comparing it to the city today. They will be encouraged to gain skills of chronology, change and consequence and looking at key figures and their contribution to the history of Wolverhampton. The children will use a range of maps, photographs, sources, oral histories and their first hand experience to learn about Wolverhampton.
