Science- Properties and Changes of Materials

Building on prior knowledge of States of Matter from Year 4, children will investigate the materials and their properties and investigate changes of states which can be reversed or irreversible.

History- The Stone Age to the Iron Age

Expanding on their prior knowledge of settlers in Britain, the children will investigate the chronology of the Stone Age to Iron Age, developing their understanding of how people's lives have changed over periods of time.

Art and Design: Patterns & Print

Children will investigate the printing techniques of Lino Printing and batik. They will explore the history of these techniques and the work of famous artists that used these techniques in their work

Religious Education — Denominations of Christianity

Children will investigate and explore the differences and similarities in beliefs and practices between different denominations of the Christian faith.

Year 5 Curriculum

The Circle of Life

PSHCE- Staying Safe and Privacy in the Press

Children will further enrich their understanding of how to keep themselves safe online, understanding the key differences between personal and private information and fake news.

Geography- The Mountain Environment

Children will develop an understanding of how the land is used, relating this to economic activity. Children will be able to investigate different types of mountains, key features and understand their formation and will be able to identify them in the environment. Trip and Field Study-Dovedale

Music- Composition Notation and Blues

Children will learn to identify the pitch and rhythm of written notes and then experiment with notating their composition Children will investigate blues throughout history, identifying the key features and mood of Blues music.

Design & <u>Technology</u>; Making a tablet/iPad case

Children will develop their sewing skills and finishing skills to enhance the quality of iPad cases for a specific target audience.

Physical Education-Invasion Cames

Children will develop their understanding of invasion games, drawing upon key skills, strategies and rules to outsmart or overpower an opposing team. Children will develop agility, speed, strength, attacking techniques, tactical plans, and solve problems.
