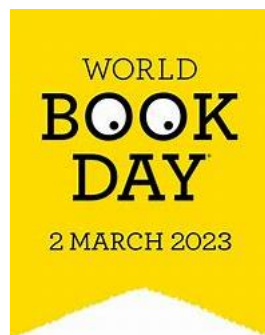


Find your wings and fly...



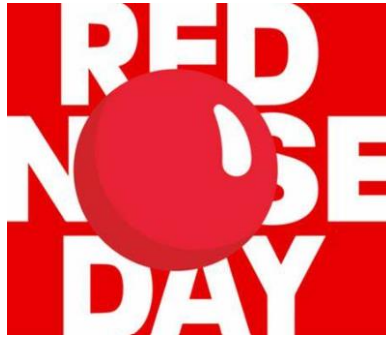
Our photographer has been in school over the last two days, we are expecting our proof cards after half term for parents and carers to purchase any photographs online.
